The Old via the New

The library has several books in electronic format, for example, our featured book. These books are located on the public computer in the main room of the library. They deal with the history of New Mexico and Sierra county. They are no longer under copyright and can therefore be used either at the library or can be copied to the user's computer or reader and used there. Featured This Month

New Mexico Mines and Minerals: *World's Fair Edition, 1904* by Fayette Alexander Jones.

The book starts with a brief history of the mining that took place before the coming of the Europeans and during the Spanish domination. According to the author, there were only two mines worthy of the name during that period, the famous Turquoise mine near Los Cerrillos that was used by the natives long before the coming of the Europeans and a nearby gold mine worked by primitive means during the Spanish domination. He considered the rest of the ancient mining as equivalent to what was currently called prospecting.

The second, and major, part of the book is a brief summary of all of the mining districts in New Mexico. The author was a mining engineer and was directly involved with a large fraction of the areas discussed, both as a participant and as a government representative in various capacities. The descriptions were written at a time when the history of the mines was common—sometimes firsthand—knowledge of the people in the area and in some cases the discoverers and developers of the mines were still available.

The book is very enthusiastic about the prospects of



mining in New Mexico. One of the more exuberant comments being: "The trough of the Rio Grande is thus seen to be a vast storehouse of gold." He does not, however, minimize the difficulty of successfully developing a mine. He tells of as many failures as successes, and discusses the reasons he thinks that they did or did not succeed.

The final part of the book is a discussion of the other resources he sees available in New Mexico. This section extends its scope from the metal ores emphasized in the mining district summaries to include such resources as iron, coal, salt, clay, brick, stone, cement, plaster, mica, gems, precious stones, petroleum, radium, mineral waters, wells, and river waters.

I found the book surprisingly interesting. It is a blending of historical, geological and economic information imparted in a way that explains many of the things I have seen wandering about the countryside in New Mexico and giving an interesting virtual tour of areas I have yet to visit.
