Featured this Month


Listening is an Act of Love *edited by Dave Isay*

The stories from **Listening Is an Act of Love** are transcriptions of recordings of interviews made under the National Public Radio StoryCorps Project.



StoryCorps was started in 2003 under the premise that everyone has an important story to tell. The accounts were collected from people young and old from various socio-economic and cultural backgrounds from all regions of the country. The speakers are ordinary people recounting personal and/or family stories. They tell of joy and sorrow, gains and losses, good times and bad.

“My brother died of AIDS,” I said.

“You don’t have to whisper to me,” he said.

He came around the counter to hug me. And I didn’t know him. But I loved him.

Some accounts are tragically painful; others, humorous; still others simply inspiring. But regardless of subject, each story rings with unvarnished honesty. And as personal as these stories may be, each one carries the kind of empathetic message that connects us all as human beings.

We all need to be listened to. To truly listen is indeed an act of love.
