Start at the Beginning

Big book news at the end of last month was the publication in the United States of the final book of the Stieg Larsson “Millennium” trilogy—a series of detective novels that takes place on the dark side of Sweden. You can begin with the first novel, recently acquired by the Library, and follow the adventures of crusading journalist, Michael Blomquist, and Larsson’s remarkable heroine—Lisbeth Salander, a goth-styling autodidact and computer wizard. She’s the girl with the dragon tattoo.

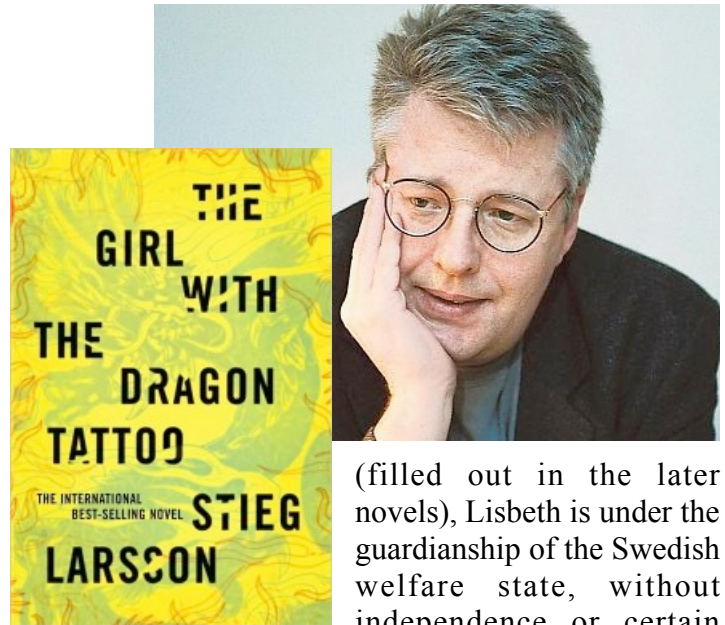
Featured This Month:

The Girl with the Dragon Tattoo by Stieg Larsson

We meet Michael Blomquist at a low point in his career; he’s on his way to prison for libeling a high-flying Swedish industrialist—and he doesn’t know what went wrong. Blomquist is sure that Erik Wennerstrom is crooked, but that somehow he’s managed to set Blomquist up and escape justice. And injustice is something Blomquist (and probably Larsson) feel in the bone.

With his magazine—*Millennium*—in trouble, Blomquist accepts a strange commission offered by Henrik Vanger, another VIP businessman. Ostensibly Blomquist will rehabilitate his reputation by writing a history of the Vanger family, but what Henrik really wants the journalist to uncover is the mysterious fate his grandniece Harriet who disappeared nearly forty years ago and who, Vanger believes, was murdered by someone in or close to the family. If Blomquist can solve this mystery, Vanger will provide the goods on Wennerstrom.

So what does Blomquist need most?—a researcher and investigator who knows how to find obscure information. Enter Lisbeth Salander, a young woman with some of her own ideas about justice. Anti-social and misunderstood, with a horrifying childhood



(filled out in the later novels), Lisbeth is under the guardianship of the Swedish welfare state, without independence or certain civil rights, making her vulnerable to those in the system whom power has corrupted. Yet, she is gifted—with a cold-blooded determination and astounding intellectual and technological skills that will make her enemies rue the day they thought they had her pegged as pierced and tattooed trash.

Together Blomquist and Salander unravel the dark secrets of the Vanger family, turn the tables on Wennerstrom and balance the scales of justice—none too delicately.

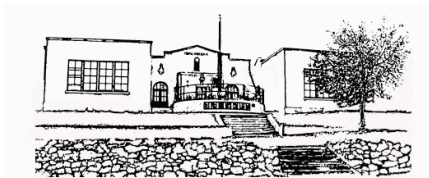
(A note: this novel, titled in Swedish “Men Who Hate Women” takes misogyny as an overriding theme and contains some graphically described scenes of violence.)
