The Periodical Collection at HCL

Have you checked out the extensive magazine collection that the library keeps in the Betty Reynolds Reading Room? The library subscribes to *New Mexico Magazine*, *Consumer Reports* and *Cowboys & Indians*, and we regularly receive *Consumer Reports On Health*, *Consumer Reports Money Advisor*, *WebMD & WebMD Pets*, *US Fish & Wildlife Service*, and *Eddies – Reflections on Fisheries Conservation*. In addition, our generous patrons donate many magazines, including *Golf Digest*, *Time Magazine*, *Petroglyphs*, *The Smithsonian Magazine*, *Travel & Leisure*, *National Geographic*, *NM Wildlife*, *Poets & Writers*, *Sierra*, *Real Simple*, *On Earth*, *Living Bird*, *Science News*, *Poetry*, *Veranda* and many more. We also have reference works in magazine or pamphlet form: the *NM Historical Review* and *Password – El Paso County Historical Society*. The Hillsboro Historical Society stores a great deal of information on this area which may be used on-site in the reading room, although it is not available for check out.

I try and read every issue of *New Mexico Magazine* since seeing an ad on the back cover of the magazine in 2000 is the reason I decided to move to this area. I enjoy the stories about places of interest in the state, as well as suggestions for restaurants and unique dining experiences and learning about opportunities to experience works by varied and talented artists who call New Mexico home. I find the “One of Our



50 is Missing” column to be particularly amusing and accurate. It amazes me how many people seem to lose the fifth-largest state in the union that lies between Texas and Arizona. In fact, my wife, Cindy, recently had a first-hand experience with this.
